The Watergate scandal was triggered by the break-in, in June 1972, at the Democratic National Committee headquarters at the Watergate office complex in Washington D.C. The scandal eventually led to the resignation of President Richard Nixon on 9 August 1974.

Step by step, the public interrogations conducted by both parties - recorded extensively by the U.S. networks - were able to uncover the truth after many twists and turns.
