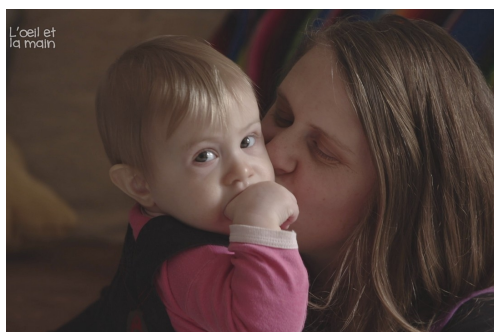
Are deaf women even more vulnerable to such violence?
